

Koalas are one of Australia's most iconic animals. They are nocturnal marsupials who sleep for up to 20 hours a day.

Habitat

Koalas are unique to Australia. They can be found in Eastern Australia, including Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia. They live in tall, eucalypts forests.

Appearance

Koalas measure between 60cm and 85cm and weigh around 14kg. They have large, round heads with big fluffy ears and black noses. Their fur is grey-brown and white.

Diet

Koalas are fussy animals and eat the leaves of only some of the 700 different eucalypts varieties. Adult koalas eat between 0.5 to 1kg of leaves every night. They also need to drink water.

Interesting fact

Koala populations are declining, They are losing their homes to excessive tree clearing, forcing them to spend more time on the ground where they become vulnerable to predators and cars.
